
Introduction

This report provides the latest key information from Homefinder Somerset.

Households registered with Homefinder Somerset

There were 10,697 households registered with Homefinder Somerset on 1 July 2022, an increase of 1,119 households (12%) from 1 April 2022. This includes households with a Live application and those who are being considered for a property (with the status of 'Offered').

Chart 1 shows that over the quarter there has been an average of 950 new applications made to Homefinder Somerset each month¹. Whilst not all these applications will be set to 'Live' (e.g. if a household does not provide the required mandatory evidence), it shows the volume of new applications. Applications will be set to Housed if they are successful, or closed for a range of reasons (e.g. they have resolved their own housing need, following a request from the applicant etc.), but the increase in the number of Live applications is exacerbated by the fact the renewals functionality has not been live since the transfer to the new IT system in August 2021. This is currently being tested and will go live in the summer.



The proportion of households in Gold Band is similar in all 4 local authority areas, ranging from 7% in Sedgemoor to 9% in South Somerset. The proportion of households in the Silver Band is similar in 3 of the 4 local authorities (36 - 39%), whilst Mendip has a higher proportion (52%). The proportion of households in Bronze Band ranges from 40% in Mendip to 56% in Somerset West & Taunton.


Note: The percentages refer to the proportion of households who are in that Band (e.g. 8% of all households are in Gold Band). The percentage given for the total refers to the proportion of all households registered with a particular local authority (e.g. 23% of households are registered with Sedgemoor DC).

Table 2 and Chart 2 show that the number of households registered with Homefinder Somerset has increased by 30% since Q4 2016/17. Although there has been some variation overtime between the 4 local authorities, overall the increase has been very similar across Somerset. As stated above, the increase is partly due to the fact that the normal renewal process has been suspended since August 2021.

Just over half (52%) of all households registered with Homefinder Somerset need a 1 bed home, whilst 28% need a 2 bed home.

Bidding Analysis

Between 1 April and 30 June, a total of 57,866 bids were placed on homes across Somerset. Chart 3 shows that the number of bids placed each month has been on an upward trend (shown by the blue dotted trendline), even taking into the big falls in the number of bids due to the 2 national lockdowns and the IT transfer. June saw the highest number of bids placed since this data started to be recorded in April 2019.

Chart 3: Number of bids 1 January 2019 - 30 June 2022




Table 4 below shows the proportion of households with Live applications by local authority and Band who can be considered as inactive (e.g. they have not bid or logged onto the Homefinder Somerset website in the last 6 months). The table reveals that 18% of households registered with Homefinder Somerset have not bid or logged into the Homefinder Somerset website in the last 6 months. As would be expected, the proportion of inactive households increases as their Band reduces (e.g. 12% of households in Gold Band are inactive compared to 21% in Bronze Band).

Table 5 reveals that an average of 99 bids were placed for the 585 homes advertised between 1 April and 30 June 2022. This is a significant increase from the average of 73 bids over the year from 1 April 2021 to 31 March 2022. This is perhaps unsurprising given the evidence above showing the increase in the number of households registered with Homefinder Somerset, and the upward trend in the number of bids.

The average number of bids varied considerably between local authority areas, property type and size. The average number of bids for houses (136) was nearly twice that for flats (72). This difference can be even more marked. For example, in Sedgemoor there was an average of 185 bids for 23 x 2 bed houses advertised compared to an average of only 30 bids for the 23 x 2 bed flats.

The average number of bids for homes advertised during the quarter ranged from 78 bids in South Somerset (177 homes advertised) to 117 in Somerset West & Taunton (157 homes advertised).

236 homes (40%) advertised during the last quarter received over 100 bids. The highest number of bids received was 415, for a 1 bed house in Bridgwater.

Homes Let

489 homes across Somerset were set to let² between 1 April and 30 June.

Tables 6 and 7 set out the profile of the homes let in the last quarter by size, local authority, and landlord. 39% of homes let in the last quarter were 2 bed, 36% were 1 bed homes, and 24% were 3 bed homes. South Somerset accounted for the highest number of homes let (172).

Abri (32%), LiveWest (13%), Somerset West & Taunton (11%), Homes in Sedgemoor (10%), Magna (10%), Aster (10%) and Stonewater (7%) together accounted for 93% of homes let in the last quarter.

Tables 8 and 9 show that nearly half (47%) of homes were let to households in the Gold band. The proportion of homes let to households in the Gold Band varied from 40% of homes in Somerset

West & Taunton to 59% of homes in Sedgemoor. 42% of homes let in the last quarter were let to households in the Silver band. This ranged from 31% of homes in Sedgemoor to 47% in Somerset West & Taunton.

The proportion of homes let to applicants in Gold Band amongst the 7 landlords who let the most homes in the last quarter varied from 44% for Magna to 51% for Homes in Sedgemoor (Table 9).
