Introduction

This report provides the latest key information from Homefinder Somerset and covers the quarter from 1 October to 31 December 2023.

Please note that on 1 April 2023 the 4 district councils (Mendip, Sedgemoor, Somerset West & Taunton, and South Somerset) and Somerset County Council were replaced by a single council called Somerset Council. This report provides information for Somerset as a whole and for the 4 Housing Options Team Areas: East (which covers the former Mendip area), North (which covers the former Sedgemoor area), South (which covers the former South Somerset area) and West (which covers the former Somerset West & Taunton Council area).

Households registered with Homefinder Somerset

The number of households registered with Homefinder Somerset fell by 768 (7%) to 10,274 between 2 October 2023 and 2 January 2024. This includes households with a Live application and those who are being considered for a property (with the status of 'Offered').

The proportion of households in Gold Band was very similar across all 4 Areas, ranging from 8 – 9% of all households. However, there was more variation for Silver and Bronze Bands. The proportion of households in Silver Band ranged from 32% in West to 57% in East. Whilst the proportion of households in Bronze Band ranged from 34% in East to 60% in West.


Table 2 and Chart 1 show that the number of households registered with Homefinder Somerset has increased by 25% since Q4 2016/17. This increase was partly due to the change of IT systems in August 2021, as the normal renewal process was suspended. The renewals process resumed in October 2022 and the number of households has subsequently reduced from a high in April 2023 (Q4 2022/23).

Just over half (52%) of all households registered with Homefinder Somerset need a 1 bed home, whilst 28% need a 2 bed home.

Bidding Analysis

Between 1 October and 31 December, a total of 63,001 bids were placed on homes across Somerset. This was an increase of over 8,500 bids (16%) from the same quarter last year. Chart 2 shows that the number of bids placed each month has been on an upward trend (shown by the blue dotted trendline), even taking into the big falls in the number of bids due to the 2 national lockdowns and the IT transfer.

Table 4 below shows the proportion of households by Area Team and Band who can be considered as inactive (e.g. they have not bid or logged onto the Homefinder Somerset website in the last 6 months).

The table reveals that 15% of households registered with Homefinder Somerset have not bid or logged into the Homefinder Somerset website in the last 6 months. As would be expected, the proportion of inactive households increases as their Band reduces (e.g., 7% of households in Gold Band were inactive compared to 19% in Bronze Band).

An average of 135 bids were placed for each of the 467 homes advertised between 1 October and 31 December 2023 (Table 5). This is an increase from the average of 123 bids in the last quarter.



The average number of bids varied considerably between areas, property type and size. The average number of bids for houses (187) was again much higher than that for flats (111). Although it should be noted that the 6 homes with the highest number of bids in the last quarter were all 1 bed flats (5 in the West area and 1 in the East), each with over 400 bids.

The average number of bids for homes advertised during the quarter ranged from 103 bids in South (120 homes advertised) to 167 in East (64 homes advertised).

264 homes (57%) advertised during the last quarter received over 100 bids. The highest number of bids received was 493, for a 1 bed flat in Taunton.



Homes Let

497 homes across Somerset were set to let¹ between 1 October and 31 December. This was 12% higher than the previous quarter, when 444 homes were set to let.

Tables 6 and 7 set out the profile of the homes let in the last quarter by size, Area Team, and landlord. 40% of homes let in the last quarter were 1 bed and another 40% were 2 bed homes. West accounted for the highest number of homes let (163).

Abri (19%), Homes in Sedgemoor (16%), Somerset Council (14%), LiveWest (14%), Stonewater (11%), Aster (9%) and Magna (8%) together accounted for 90% of homes let in the last quarter.

Tables 8 and 9 show that 58% of homes were let to households in the Gold band, up from 53% in the last quarter. The proportion of homes let to households in the Gold Band varied from 48% of homes in West to 74% of homes let in South. 33% of homes were let in the last quarter were let to households in the Silver band. This ranged from 21% of homes in South to 42% in West. The Band is not recorded for 2 homes let by direct match.
