#### Introduction

This report provides the latest key information from Homefinder Somerset and covers the year from 1 April 2023 to 31 March 2024.

#### Households registered with Homefinder Somerset

The number of households registered with Homefinder Somerset fell by 2,276 (19%) to 9,627 between 31 March 2023 and 1 April 2024. This includes households with a Live application and those who are being considered for a property (with the status of 'Offered').

The proportion of households in Gold Band was similar across Somerset, varying only from 8% in West to 10% in East and South. However, the proportion of households in Silver and Bronze Bands varied more significantly. The proportion of households in Silver Band ranged from 34% in West to 56% in East, whilst the proportion in Bronze Band ranged from 34% in East to 58% in West.


Table 2 and Chart 1 show that the number of households registered with Homefinder Somerset increased by 17% since Q4 2016/17. However, as stated above, there was a reduction over the last year. This is due to the annual review process being fully operational again.

Homefinder Somerset Quarterly Monitoring Report April 2024 Chart 1: Number of households registered by Area. Q4 2016/17 as the base




Just over half (52%) of all households registered with Homefinder Somerset need a 1 bed home, whilst 28% need a 2 bed home.

## **Bidding Analysis**

Between 1 April 2023 and 31 March 2024, a total of 270,589 bids were placed on homes across Somerset. This was an increase of 17% from the previous year. Chart 2 shows the number of bids placed each month has been on an upward trend (shown by the blue dotted trendline), even taking into the big falls in the number of bids due to the 2 national lockdowns and the IT transfer. January 2024 saw the largest number of bids placed in any month – 34,050.

Table 4 below shows the proportion of households by Area and Band who can be considered as inactive (e.g. they have not bid or logged onto the Homefinder Somerset website in the last 6 months).

The table reveals that 13% of households registered with Homefinder Somerset have not bid or logged into the Homefinder Somerset website in the last 6 months. This is down from 22% at 31 March 2023, due to the annual review process. As would be expected, the proportion of inactive households increases as their Band reduces (e.g., 6% of households in Gold Band were inactive compared to 17% in Bronze Band).

Table 5 reveals that an average of 128 bids were placed for the 2,035 homes advertised between 1 April 2023 and 31 March 2024. This is an increase from an average of 109 bids in the previous year. This is perhaps unsurprising given the evidence above which reveals that there has been in an increase in the number of bids placed over the last 4 years.



The average number of bids varied considerably between areas, property type and size. The average number of bids for houses (187) was again much higher than that for flats (83). This difference can be even more marked. For example, in North there was an average of 266 bids for the 113 x 2 bed houses that were advertised compared to an average of 67 bids for the 96 x 2 bed flats.

The average number of bids for homes advertised during the year ranged from 105 bids in South (570 homes advertised) to 148 in North (542 homes advertised).

1,091 homes (54%) advertised during the year received 100 bids or more. The highest number of bids received was 500, for a 1 bed bungalow in North Petherton.

## Homes Let

1,914 homes across Somerset were set to let<sup>1</sup> between 1 April 2023 and 31 March 2024. Tables 6 and 7 set out the profile of the homes let over the year by size, area, and landlord. 45% of homes let were 1 bed and 37% were 2 bed homes. West accounted for the highest number of homes let (630), whilst only 265 homes were let in East.

Abri (19%), Somerset Council (16%), Homes in Sedgemoor (15%), Stonewater (11%), LiveWest (10%), Aster (9%) and Magna (8%) together accounted for 88% of homes let over the year.

Tables 8 & 9 show that 53% of homes were let to households in the Gold band, a higher proportion than seen in the previous 3 years (43 - 44%). This proportion varied from 47% of homes let in West to 62% of homes let in South. 33% of homes were let to households in the Silver band. This ranged from 24% of homes in South to 38% in West. The Band is not recorded for 34 homes let by direct match<sup>2</sup>.

The proportion of homes let to applicants in Gold Band amongst the 7 landlords who let the most homes also varied, from 62% for Stonewater to 43% for Magna (Table 9). Magna also let 5% of homes to households in Emergency Band.

Nearly 38,000 homes have been let through Homefinder Somerset since 2009. The total number of homes let per year and by size is shown in Table 10.
