Introduction

This report provides the latest key information from Homefinder Somerset and covers the year from 1 April 2024 to 31 March 2025.

Households registered with Homefinder Somerset

The number of households registered with Homefinder Somerset increased by 2,898 (30%) to 12,525 between 1 April 2024 and 1 April 2025. This includes households with a Live application and those who are being considered for a property (with the status of 'Offered'). A significant proportion of this increase was due to the clearance of a backlog of applications waiting to be assessed.

8% of households across the county were in Gold Band, 37% in Silver Band and 55% in Bronze Band. Just over half of all households (52%) had been assessed as needing a 1 bed home, whilst 28% had been assessed as needing a 2 bed home.

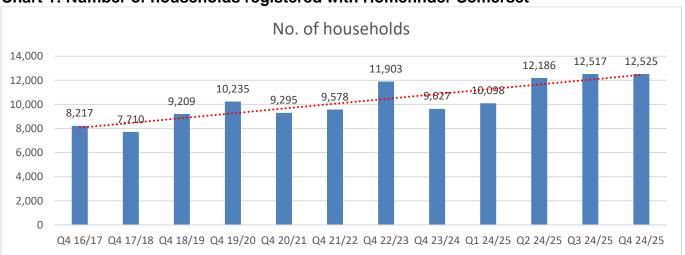

Note: The percentages refer to the proportion of all households who are in that Band and need a home of that size (e.g. 11% of all households were in Silver Band and needed a 2 bed home, 52% of households needed a 1 bed home, and 8% of households were awarded Gold Band).

Chart 1 shows that the number of households registered with Homefinder Somerset has increased by 4,308 (52%) since Q4 2016/17. There was a particular increase in the quarter to 30 September 2024 due to the work to address the backlog of applications. The red dotted line on Chart 1 shows the trendline.

Bidding Analysis

Between 1 April 2024 and 31 March 2025, a total of 272,267 bids were placed on homes across Somerset. This was a small increase of just under 1% from the previous year. Chart 2 shows the number of bids placed each month has been on an upward trend (shown by the blue dotted trendline), even taking into the big falls in the number of bids due to the 2 national lockdowns and the IT transfer. October 2024 saw the largest number of bids placed in any month – 34,099.

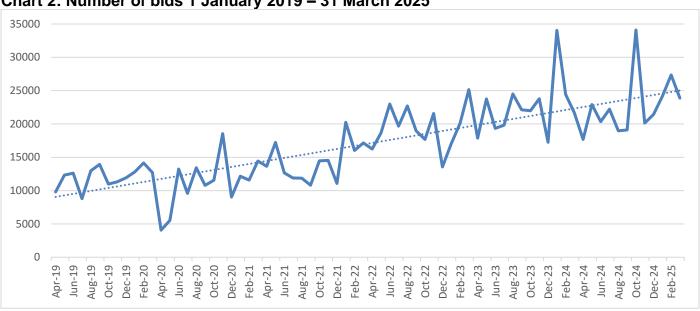


Chart 2: Number of bids 1 January 2019 – 31 March 2025

Table 2 below shows the proportion of households by Area and Band who can be considered as inactive (e.g. they have not bid or logged onto the Homefinder Somerset website in the last 6 months).

The table reveals that 16% of households registered with Homefinder Somerset have not bid or logged into the Homefinder Somerset website in the last 6 months. This is up from 13% at 31 March 2024. However, the increase is wholly down to households in Bronze Band. The proportion of inactive households in Gold and Silver Bands have fallen (from 6% and 9% respectively), whilst the proportion of inactive households in Bronze Band increased from 17% to 21%. As would be expected, the proportion of inactive households increases as their Band reduces (e.g., 4% of households in Gold Band were inactive compared to 21% in Bronze Band).

Table 3 reveals that an average of 147 bids were placed for the 1,748 homes advertised between 1 April 2024 and 31 March 2025. This is an increase from an average of 128 bids in the previous year. This is perhaps explained by the fact that the number of homes advertised in the year fell from 2,035 in 2023/24, a reduction of 14%, so there was likely to be more bids for those homes that were advertised.



The average number of bids varied considerably between areas, property type and size. The average number of bids for houses (184) was again higher than that for flats (127). This difference can be even more marked. For example, in East there was an average of 259 bids for the 35 x 2 bed houses that were advertised compared to an average of 69 bids for the 40 x 2 bed flats.

The average number of bids for homes advertised during the year ranged from 132 bids in South (461 homes advertised) to 164 in West (524 homes advertised).

^{1,005} homes (57%) advertised during the year received 100 bids or more. The highest number of bids received was 660, for a new build, 1 bed flat in Taunton.



Homes Let

1,811 homes across Somerset were set to let¹ between 1 April 2024 and 31 March 2025. This was a drop of 5% from 1,914 homes let in 2023/24.

Tables 4 and 5 set out the profile of the homes let over the year by size, area, and landlord. 43% of homes let were 1 bed and 39% were 2 bed homes. West accounted for the highest number of homes let (630), whilst only 265 homes were let in East.

Abri (23%), Somerset Council (15%), LiveWest (13%), Homes in Sedgemoor (13%), Aster (10%), Stonewater (7%), and Magna (7%) together accounted for 87% of homes let over the year.

Tables 6 & 7 show that 61% of homes were let to households in Emergency or Gold band. This proportion varied from 52% of homes let in North to 74% of homes let in East. 29% of homes were let to households in the Silver band. This ranged from 21% of homes in South to 37% in North. The Band is not recorded for 40 homes let by direct match².

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The proportion of homes let to applicants in Emergency or Gold Bands amongst the 7 landlords who let the most homes also varied, from 77% for Stonewater to 45% for Homes in Sedgemoor.

39,810 homes have been let through Homefinder Somerset since 2009. The total number of homes let per year and by size is shown in Table 8.
